ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

In the Matter of Simona Brinkman,
respondent-appellant, v Jason Jackson,
appellant-respondent.

(Docket No. F-1281-05)

Appeal and cross appeal from an order of the Family Court, Kings County, dated March 20, 2009. By scheduling order dated May 5, 2009, the appellant-respondent Jason Jackson was directed to file one of the following in the office of the clerk of the court, within 30 days after the date of the scheduling order:

- (1) an affidavit or affirmation stating that there were no minutes of the Family Court proceedings to be transcribed for the appeal; or
- (2) if there were such minutes, an affidavit or affirmation that the transcript was received, and indicating the date that it was received; or
- (3) if the transcript was not received, an affidavit or affirmation stating that it was ordered and paid for, the date thereof and the date by which the transcript was expected; or
- (4) an affidavit or an affirmation withdrawing the appeal.

The appellant-respondent has failed to comply with the scheduling order. Pursuant to § 670.4(a)(5) of the rules of this court (22 NYCRR 670.4[a][5]), it is

ORDERED that the parties or their attorneys are directed to show cause before this court why an order should or should not be made and entered dismissing the appeal by Jason Jackson in the above-entitled proceeding for failure to comply with the scheduling order dated May 5, 2009,
