Court of Appeals to hold session in Buffalo

The Court of Appeals will travel to Buffalo for a one-day session on April 14, marking the Court's first official visit to the Niagara Frontier since the nineteenth century. Oral arguments will be held in the ceremonial courtroom of Old County Hall at 92 Franklin Street, giving Western New Yorkers a firsthand opportunity to see the state's highest court at work outside of Court of Appeals Hall in Albany.

The Court has chosen five cases from Erie County for the calendar, including both civil and criminal appeals. Arguments are open to the public and will begin at 1 p.m. Broadcast media interested in a live feed of the proceedings should contact the Court's public information office. Following the session, judges of the Court will attend the annual dinner of the University at Buffalo Law Alumni Association. The Court's visit to Buffalo was prompted by an invitation from Terrance P. Flynn, president of the alumni association.

On Friday, April 15, the Court will join Presiding Justice Eugene F. Pigott, Jr., Administrative Judge Sharon S. Townsend and other members of the Western New York judiciary at a breakfast honoring retired Court of Appeals Judge Matthew J. Jasen. The visit will end with a luncheon hosted by the Western New York Chapter of the Women's Bar Association of New York, where Chief Judge Judith S. Kaye will receive the chapter's M. Dolores Denman Award.
