## **MEMORANDUM:**

The order of the Appellate Division should be affirmed.

Under both federal and state constitutional standards,

defendant "bears the burden of establishing his claim[s] that

counsel's performance is constitutionally deficient" (People v

Nicholson, 26 NY3d 813, 831 [2016]). Defendant "must demonstrate

the absence of strategic or other legitimate explanations for counsel's alleged failure" ( $\underline{\text{id.}}$ ). On this record, defendant has not met that burden.

Defendant presents ineffective assistance of counsel claims that are "of the type where 'it . . . [is] essential[] that an appellate attack on the effectiveness of counsel be bottomed on an evidentiary exploration by collateral or post-conviction proceeding brought under CPL 440.10'" (People v Henderson, 28 NY3d 63, 66 [2016], quoting People v Brown, 45 NY2d 852, 854 [1978]).
