


# NYC COUNCIL STUDENT SAFETY ACT







#### **DISPROPORTIONALITY**


- Black students compared to White Students
  - 4x more likely to be suspended
  - **14x** more likely to be arrested
- Hispanic students compared to White Students
  - 2x more likely to be suspended
  - 5x more likely to be arrested
- Students receiving special education services compared to students not receiving services
  - 4x more likely to be suspended




