## CRIMINAL SALE OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE FOURTH DEGREE (C Felony)

PENAL LAW 220.34(3) (Concentrated Cannabis) (Committed on or after Sept. 1, 1979)

## PENAL LAW 220.34(5) (Methadone) (Committed on or after Sept. 1, 1979)

The \_\_\_\_\_ count is Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree.

Under our law, a person is guilty of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree when that person knowingly and unlawfully sells a narcotic preparation [*or* concentrated cannabis] [*or* methadone].

Some of the terms used in this definition have their own special meaning in our law. I will now give you the meaning of the following terms: ["narcotic preparation"], "sell," "knowingly," and "unlawfully."

[The term NARCOTIC PREPARATION includes <u>(specify</u>).<sup>2</sup>]

SELL means to sell, exchange, give or dispose of to another [or to offer or agree to do the same].<sup>3</sup>

A person KNOWINGLY sells <u>(specify)</u> when that person is aware that he or she is selling a substance which contains <u>(specify)</u>.<sup>4</sup>

A person UNLAWFULLY sells <u>(specify)</u> when that person has no legal right to sell that substance.<sup>5</sup> Under our law, with certain exceptions not applicable here, a person has no legal right to sell

## <u>(specify)</u>.

In order for you to find the defendant guilty of this crime, the People are required to prove, from all the evidence in the case, beyond a reasonable doubt, both of the following two elements:

- 1. That on or about <u>(date)</u>, in the county of <u>(county)</u>, the defendant, <u>(defendant's name)</u>, sold a substance containing <u>(specify)</u>; and
- 2. That the defendant did so knowingly and unlawfully.

Therefore, if you find that the People have proven beyond a reasonable doubt both of those elements, you must find the defendant guilty of the crime of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree as charged in the \_\_\_\_ count.

On the other hand, if you find that the People have not proven beyond a reasonable doubt either one or both of those elements, you must find the defendant not guilty of the crime of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree as charged in the \_\_\_\_ count.
